

#### EPA Issues Guidance on Clean Water Act Water Quality Certification

On Friday, June 7th, the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) released its guidance on Section 401 of the Clean Water Act (CWA). Under Executive Order 13868, "Promoting Energy Infrastructure and Economic Growth," EPA was directed to issue guidance for federal permitting agencies and state and authorized tribal authorities to "modernize previous guidance" and darify existing CWA Section 401 requirements. Executive Order 13868 also directed EPA to propose new rules modernizing the agency's CWA Section 401 implementing regulations by August 8, 2019. The agency intends to propose regulations that may help further clarify and streamline CWA Section 401 certifications. The guidance as written proposes significant restrictions on state and tribal authority to condition Section 401 permits. The Association of State Wetland Managers (ASWM) submitted a comment letter in advance of the guidance which can be found here and is working on a response to the newly issued guidance.





#### Who can get Certificates of Participation?


