

Links are also pin NatureServe Explorer and the US. National Vegetation Classification Hierarchy Explorer along with guidant extract descriptions of wetland plant communities from those sites for specific areas of interest.

The site also provides information about the activities of the Wetland Mapping Consortum including future and past recorded weblinant; Coastal Mapping Resources, a summary of the status of state wetland mapping federal and state wetland cellingation manuals, numerous wetland publications, and federal agency wetland publications.

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


