




WEBINAR #2: A PATH TO SUCCESSFUL EPA GRANT APPLICATIONS







Webinar Overview:

Today's webinar will provide information and lessons learned on successfully obtaining EPA grants for Tribal Wetland Programs. For many tribes, EPA funding is critical to starting and sustaining a wetland program. However, EPA grant applications can be daunting, especially for first-time applicants. This webinar will help guide tribal wetland staff through the application process and will include advice on pre-planning, evaluating grant options, deciphering the request for proposals (RFP), the importance of Wetland Program Plans (WPPs) and partnerships, and project budgeting.


Capacity Support Grants

Tribes, Alaska Native Corporations, tribal organizations and Native-led nonprofits are eligible to apply for \$3,000 grants to cover staff time or to hire outside consultants to support them with their Landscape Scale Restoration grant application. 

The Wetland Program focuses on the preservation, protection, enhancement, restoration, and management of wetlands and their associated ecological services both on the Nez Perce Reservation and within the larger traditional use areas of the Nez Perce Tribe. Rue has received degrees in Zoology and Wildlife Ecology from Idaho State University and Wetland Professional Certification from Portland State University and Clackamas Community College.
